The Google Hangout in Big Data Biology (BIO00047I)

This module will use a Google Hangout chatroom to share questions, plots, R code and sometimes to announce any errors in the website that we find. Some people find the R code useful as a resource. As your posts are personal data it requires consideration of GDPR compliance. So here is some guidance on how we'll use it.

- The use of the Hangout is **optional**. There is no requirement to sign into, read or use the Hangout.
- If you do want to use it, you must sign in using your York account.
- · We don't allow anonymous posting.
- Anything you post goes out to the entire group. Please be kind and helpful.
- Feel free to chat (but don't post anything racist, sexist or defamatory).
- Plots you post may be shown to the entire class, as a shining example of your skill.
- You have the right your ask that your post/posts are deleted.
- You may leave the hangout any time.
- All group threads will be deleted when the module ends (after the assessment has been marked).
- Officially, University of York has control of the group. In practice, the group owner (Daniel Jeffares) has the ability delete posts.
